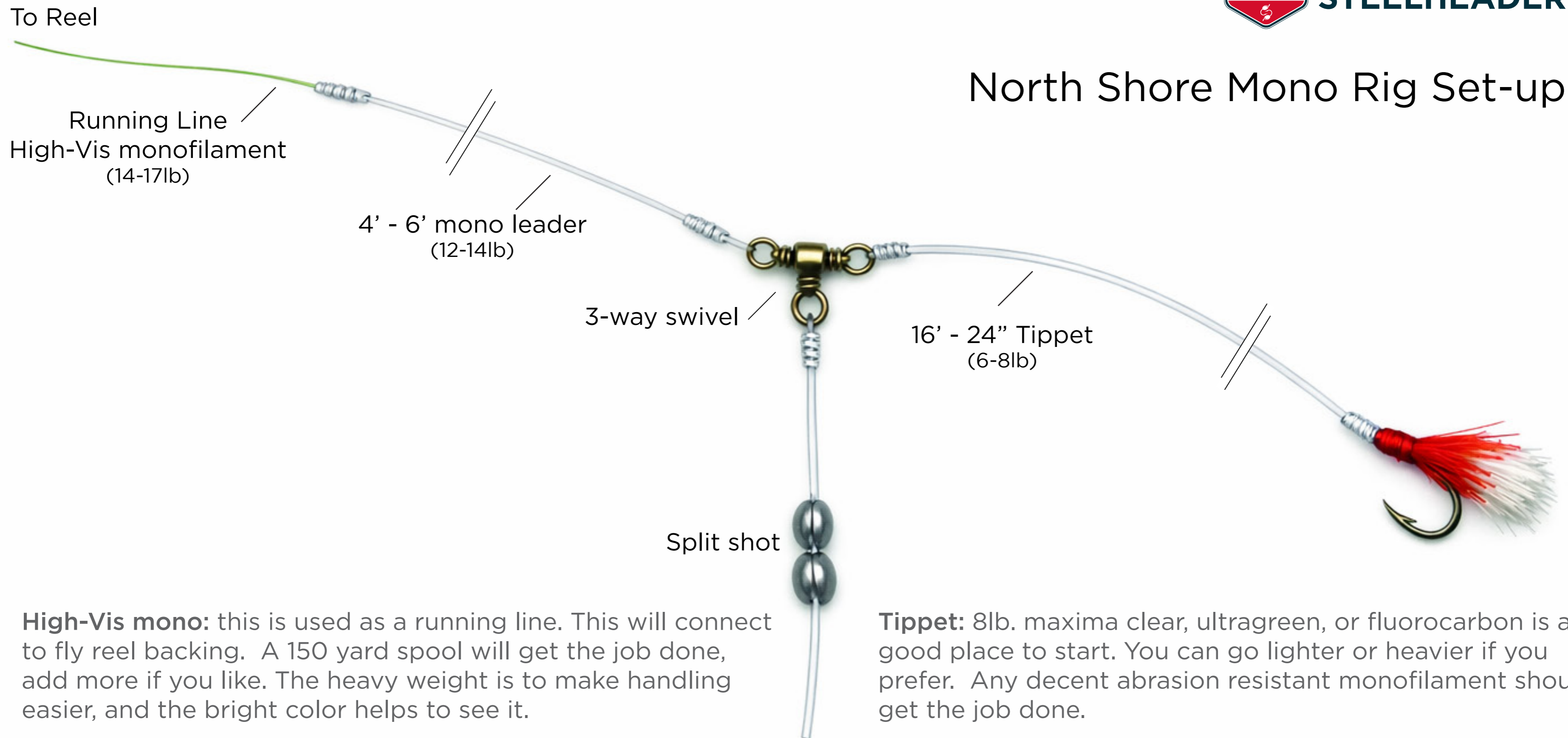


North Shore Mono Rig Set-up



High-Vis mono: this is used as a running line. This will connect to fly reel backing. A 150 yard spool will get the job done, add more if you like. The heavy weight is to make handling easier, and the bright color helps to see it.

Leader: A length around 4'-8' is a good start. Size it lighter than your running line yet heavier than your tippet. Use clear or low vis monofilament or fluorocarbon.

Swivel: use a small 3-way swivel. It is a good idea to replace swivels that show wear, they can break from the beating they take in the rocks.

Tippet: 8lb. maxima clear, ultragreen, or fluorocarbon is a good place to start. You can go lighter or heavier if you prefer. Any decent abrasion resistant monofilament should get the job done.

Split Shot: Use a brand that is removable and get a few different sizes. You only need enough to tap the river bottom on your drift,. Chang the amount as conditions change.

Note: These are intended as general recommendations only. We encourage you to experiment and modify to fit changing conditions, fly type, or technique. We recommend lighter setups for fall coasters, pinks, and coho salmon.
